Lifetime Achievement Award Presented to Wheaton Park District Leader

La Grange IL— On January 24, 2025, the Illinois Park & Recreation Association (IPRA) honored Mike Benard, Executive Director of the Wheaton Park District with the IPRA Robert Artz Lifetime Achievement Award, for his commitment and lifetime of service to parks, recreation, and conservation in Illinois. Mr. Bernard was recognized during the IPRA Awards Program at the IAPD/IPRA Soaring to New Heights Conference held at the Hyatt Regency Chicago.

The IPRA Robert Artz Lifetime Achievement Award was established to honor Robert Artz's legacy of service to the park and recreation profession. The recipient's efforts will have had a lasting impact and created awareness of the importance of parks and recreation among peers and in the community they serve.

Mike Benard is a visionary leader whose dedication and innovation have transformed the field of parks and recreation. During his distinguished career, he has driven transformative results for the Wheaton Park District, earning prestigious accolades such as the IAPD/IPRA Distinguished Agency Award, Association of Zoos and Aquariums accreditation, and Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary Designation for Arrowhead Golf Club.

A strategic planner, Mike developed the district's 2010-2014 and 2016-2019 strategic plans and founded the Agency Leadership Academy to foster staff development. His leadership has also secured over \$16 million in philanthropic funding and \$9.6 million in grants, advancing community projects like Memorial Park's redevelopment and the adaptive reuse of Wheaton Central High School.

Beyond Wheaton, Mike has shaped the industry statewide through leadership roles with organizations such as the Western DuPage Special Recreation Association and advisory committees at SIU.
